JOURNEY TOWARDS EXCELLENCE

"Continual Improvement is a journey towards Excellence" in any field, and for it systems need to be built up.

With a thought to systemize the School Education Processes and aiming to enhance it, the journey towards excellence started with a workshop for Pedagogies and culminated in achieving Accreditation from National Accreditation Board for Education and Training (NABET) from Quality Council of India (QCI).

The path was full of challenges for the Director Principal Ms. Alpa S. Kotadia, right from convincing the Management to motivating the staff to work beyond their comfort zones. Hours of Brainstorming and discussion started. It seemed to be an impossible task, but the determination and perseverance of the leadership team was not to be underestimated. They all kept on hand holding, mentoring, supporting and encouraging the staff. The staff in turn believed in the outcome and put in hours after School to achieve the desired goal.

NABET standard is divided into 3 domains - School Governance, Education and Support Process and Performance Measurement and improvement. Accordingly the School processes were divided into total of 14 Core processes - Human Resource, Admission, Statutory and Regulatory Compliance, Curriculum and Academic Program, Teaching learning, Assessment and Evaluation, Health Safety and Cleanliness, Complaint Handling, Co-curricular and Extra-curricular, Social Ethical and Moral Development, Career Guidance and Counselling, Diagnostic and Extra Support, Outsourced and Financial Resources. Apart from it Resource Utilization was developed as a support Process.

The challenge did not stop here, after about a period of a year and half, the patience of some of the staff members declined, they decided to quit the institute. The management had to make tough decision to let go some of the staff.

Change always seems difficult and so was the case, it was time to change not only the School systems but individuals too. Making of Manuals, SOP's, Templates, policies and reports all asked for a lot of time, workshops, enhancement of skills of the staff too, apart from the money and the hardwork put to it.

Finally the Readiness visit by the people of QCI NABET took place on 5th and 6th January 2017. It marked the participation of the parents and students in an utmost positive manner, impressing the Auditors. We the Staff and the Management are thankful to the parents and the students for the support they give in every new venture of the School. Finally the Readiness Visit Report turned in a positive manner with some suggestions for improvement, this instilled a zeal of achievement in the heart of every individual including the students. Making it quick our Director Principal Ms. Alpa Kotadia with her team of Ms. Rekhasasikumar, Ms. Vaishali Dabir and Ms. Suseela Narayan worked quickly towards meeting the suggestions of readiness visit and finally the date of Accreditation Assessment was received as on 2nd and 3rd April 2018. This was a golden date in history of VPS School, finally the passion, hardwork, determination, dedication and perseverance paid off and the Accreditation was achieved as on date 6th august 2018.

We are thankful towards the Director Principal, Headmistress, Process Owners, the Educators and the Staff. Continual Improvement is now a system of the School which is marked by the introduction of a new Avenue "The Space Education programme". The following article by our Director Principal Mrs. Alpa Kotadia was published in the esteemed magazine "Lead the Change" by the International Council of Schools.

My school is affiliated to CISCE for the last six academic years and has made its mark in all spheres of education. I have been Rotary president for the year 2012-13 and presently Assistant Governor for 2018-19. I had the privilege to receive the Safe Educational Institute Award-2018 and had received Shiksha Bharati Award for contributing towards Corporate Social Responsibility in education field from the worthy hands of Mrs. Kiran Bedi. I have also received the Rashtriya Shikshak Samman award by Avantika group of contemporary intellectuals by the worthy hands of Minister of State Ministry of Agriculture and farmers Welfare Mr. Parshottam Rupala in 2016. I have also been the recipient of Excellence School Leadership Award for Gujarat by Mind Mingle in 2018.

TITLE: A NEST TO NURTURE

"We are guilty of many errors and many faults, but our worst crime is abandoning the children, neglecting the formation of life. Many of the things we need can wait. The children cannot. Right now is the time his bones are being formed, his blood is being made and his senses are being developed. To him we cannot answer "Tomorrow". His need is "Today"

This observation by the Chilean poet laureate and educationist Ms Gabriella Mistrel is self-explanatory and still relevant though she had made it almost seven decades ago. Twenty first century children need a schooling that aims at their holistic development catering to their Academic, Physical, Social, Psychological and Emotional evolution.. A home away from home like a nest that represents love, growth, safety, possibilities, opportunities, skills and potential that enable them to venture into the open horizon with confidence. A well designed goal that is supported by a vision that is achievable and with a mission that encourages each child to achieve livelihood skills as well as life skills that equip him/her to face the future competently and confidently. An year plan that takes care of students of all age groups to develop skills that translates knowledge, attitude and values into abilities to cope up with the positive and negative incidents and accidents that occur in real life.

Environment has a great influence in every person's life and children are really vulnerable to their surroundings. Family and the social background, hereditary and traditional factors, peer groups, school programmes, health status, recreation and food habits have a great impact in their emotional status. Hence schools need to consider all these factors before planning their own curriculum incorporating with the board affiliated body.

Social Environment: Village to village, town to town, city to city the social environment changes and children from different back grounds react differently to same situation. Every child is a member of the society he/ she lives in: family, colony, school and other social groups behave in a manner it requires, or reacts threateningly. There are certain norms a child should fulfil to be a part of the society or he/she will be a misfit. Thus he forms a social behaviour trait which in turn becomes a character trait with long standing effect. Students of a school are a mixture of different socio –economic and cultural back ground; with nurtured and deprived children, therefore school's responsibility becomes a Herculean task to

nurture them under one umbrella.

Let us discuss some of the problems school authorities face nowadays.

Familial back ground: Majority of the present generation students come from nuclear families and are children of working parents. Quality time spend with the children varies from family to family. Guilt ridden parents find consolation by sending their children to tuition classes, hobby classes, giving electronic gadgets, smart phones, junk foods and pocket money. Some children, who come from broken families carry their own bag and baggage which distract them from studies. Lack of grandparents and other positively influencing elders presence in daily life make a vast vacuum that earlier would have been filled with stories from epics, folk songs proverbs and homely games. They are deprived of moral, ethical and cultural wisdom usually inculcated in childhood. Sharing and caring and giving without taking are concepts alien to them, their minds are burdened with much negativity.

Solutions: Insight about each and every child is a must in today's schooling. Pen picture, which gives a brief description of a child with its behaviour pattern, study habits, medical problems, family back ground and other individual concerns, should be recorded honestly and discretely from pre-school onwards. School counsellor, class teachers, subject teachers and co- curricular teachers should read and familiarise with each student's profile at the beginning of every academic year. This information can help the educators to transform a child with, love, compassion, empathy and positivity. Regular communication with parents if necessary, periodic PTMs and counselling can bring better understanding and consolidate teacher student and parent child bonding which in turn will boost trust in the child.

Class Meetings are another solution to strengthen the friendship between students. All the incidences in a class that are concerns, conflicts and confusion like rivalry, non-cooperation, jealousy, prejudices, quarrelling and appreciations are written by students and dropped into the Agenda box. Under teacher's supervision random chit is read out loud and solutions are sought out from students. It enhances student's thinking ability, empathy, self-awareness, and a better understanding of code of conduct in class. If regularly practised solutions to problems of students can be found by themselves. A successful achievement in our school! For example one student in class VIII was in the habit of using abusive language, teacher was concerned and reported to the counsellor. Principal called him and found his side of the incident, told that it is within a person's choice to use good or foul language. She briefed him about people picking up foul words in their course of life. But did he hear the Principal or teachers using such words any time? He was left to brood over it, decide for himself and report next day. May be the Class meeting and the reaction of the Principal acted as the catalysts, he apologised to the teacher, promised to control his anger and will refrain from using abusive words. Now he is a changed boy.

Restraining the students from using mobile phones, social media and internet is another concern of all schools. Mobile has become an extended limb of human body and internet an integral part of modern life. But how can we stop students from misusing or over using them? We try to develop critical thinking in students by conducting debates, collecting information for display boards, presenting skits in the morning assembly, expert's talk and staging street plays about the advantage and disadvantage of modern gadgets. Parents and teachers are urged to monitor and control the use of mobiles. If brought, sets remain with the HR department. Limiting the user time at home and supervised use cut short the danger of overusing Net facilities. Unlimited, uncontrolled exposure causes mental stress.

It is imperative for schools to have special cell for conducting good parenting workshops. Parental aspirations become a stress factor for several students. Parents having unrealistic expectations from their children turn to be pushy and inconsistent in their dealings with the child. Imperfection in parenting leads to several awkward situations in their life. Sometimes casual remarks of a parent can affect the child adversely and lead them to the brink of taking dire steps. Timely involvement of teachers and Principal can save a life. A girl who used to be somewhat timid was affected by a remark of her

mother about her complexion. She went into depression and wanted to leave home. School counsellor took long sessions with the girl and her reports urged the Principal to meet her parents to take remedial actions. Now she is a college student who has conquered her inferiority complex.

Children are laid bare to social disorders, value decline, injustice, intolerance, economic disparity and it causes emotional instability in them. Implementation of a well-planned curriculum with a feasible student teacher ratio in schools is vital today. An ambience conducive to learning such as, play grounds with sports facilities, properly ventilated class rooms, comfortable furniture and use of appropriate teaching aids bring a positive attitude among students. Educators who update their knowledge through reading books, attending workshops, learning to use technology effectively and work as mentors and facilitators are the need of today's education system. Educators should be trained to take care of students in academic, physical, emotional, familial or peer induced problems they face. Schools should meet the personal development needs of teachers through in house workshops and enrolling them for professional workshops. Their personal problems difficulty, monitoring the entire class, lack of involvement of parents, monetary concerns are some of the problems that affect the mental health of a teacher. A teacher had issues in family which in turn affected her relationship with her colleagues. It even lead to altercations and un pleasantness. Principal took her in to confidence and advised her to start meditations and breathing techniques every day. Constant monitoring and support, brought her out of that impasse and now she is proactive teacher loyal to the school and advocate of meditation. Emotional constraints can be reduced in schools through regular meetings of PTA'S, collaboration and cooperation of parents in school activities like Festivals, Picnics, competitions and celebrations. We started celebration of Grand Parents Day on Valentine's Day to change the concept of the celebration to Indian context. Our students understood, grandparents are their Valentines and their grandparents too come from far as it is on a fixed date. It offers them a chance to participate in an interesting cultural activity, smoothen the relationship within family members and strengthen the bonds with their precious little ones.

Uniforms alone cannot control the economic disparity among students in a school and the rift brought among students. We celebrate birthdays of students and staff in morning assembly and later students distribute chocolates to heads, teachers and their friends. This turned out to be an occasion to show the economic status of parents by dishing out branded varieties. This led to a policy change by instructing them to give only one rupee chocolates and hand over a book of their choice to school library as a gift. Providing and following a menu of healthy food for every day, allocating educators to monitor it, conducting talk shows regarding the benefits of healthy food, celebrating Ayurveda Day and so on can achieve the target.

Bolstering the emotional strata in students

The school has the responsibility to develop personality, relationship, reasoning ability and emotional intelligence among its students. Lack of knowledge and understanding of parents, lower educational expectations, higher psychological distress, lower self- esteem and negative peer pressure are some of the predicaments a school faces very day. Mounting inconsistencies in the family setup, society, age difference in friend circle titbits of information gained from different medias and peers all leave the children confused and experimental. The schools not having a proper syllabi for Life skill learning of its students add to inconsistencies already existing among the young generation. It is very important for the school to impart knowledge on self- awareness, self- management, social awareness and relationship skill to its students, communication skills and decision making skill .They also need connected and coordinated set of activities to acquire healthy, social and emotional skills. For this, students need a school with safe and positive climate and culture.

Every day the beginning of the learning session in a school should start with a well-planned assembly that includes individual and group activities. Besides the declaration of awards and rewards, it should be used as a means to build confidence, moral and ethical values in students. In a year an average of forty attributes can be planned as topics and students can present poems, skit, speeches and presentations every week. These can be part of House wise competitions

and the performance is appreciated, and graded, each group will work together for a well-knit presentation. We practise breathing techniques and meditation to release stress and increase self-control. Our aim is to develop Spiritual Quotient Of each Child Giving importance to their emotional Quotient and Intelligence Quotient. It inculcates faith and reverence too.

Implementation of Academic plan is monitored through teachers' lesson plans, preparatory note books, log books class log books. Teachers put up great effort to connect with the students using different strategies, teaching styles, pedagogies, class activities and technology to involve all students and make the class interesting to meet the requirement of every child's learning styles. Extra support is given to students who need them till they can merge with the main stream. Children with Special need are given special attention and equal treatment in our school. There are children who were taken away to special schools for bettering their academic performance but parents took readmission after an year as they felt the child fared better here. We conduct workshops on preventive Counselling for students, parents, teachers, staff, helpers and other connected parties like outsource personnel in transport, catering and so on. We keep an eye on the moral and ethical traits of everyone connected with school so that no student is ill-treated or neglected. Workshops on good parenting techniques, and academic orientation for parents are planned in the year plan and executed. Mentors for students, and teachers are assigned at the beginning of academic year and they do the hand holding whenever it is necessary. The school cabinet is selected through electronic polling, is well trained in all areas of discipline and respect the hierarchy and school rules. Sexual Health awareness is another area schools should work on. In our school we have age appropriate modules to create beneficial awareness among students from class I onwards. It helps them to create a healthy insight into their growing up process. Parents too need such awareness workshops for better understanding of their children. Clubs like Interact, YES , Literary, Environment and Cultural in which students organise, execute and spread consciousness about several social, economic and psychological issues and understand their social responsibility. We conduct Mindfulness programmes and Happiness programmes for parents. It is essential to improve the Spiritual Quotient of Parents to balance emotional quotient.

Children of today, live in a surrounding where they see emotions fly high, traits like truthfulness, patriotism, forgiveness, tolerance and love are dwindling, trust and peacefulness are vanishing. Therefore they are often confused, bewildered and muddled about rights and wrongs. Though Value Education is an integral part of curriculum, Is it taken seriously by all schools? Do they display code of conduct and discipline areas in key places? Emotional and anger management are of absolute significance at present. School should train teachers, students and parents through counselling and workshops to balance emotion and to manage stress. Our students can participate in external competitions and school examinations on same day without fear. Motivational talk by principal, Counselling, meditation session and breathing exercises before examination prepare them to face it calmly.

Inspire children to share and care by introducing them to the Joy of giving. Old clothes which are in good condition and grains are collected to gift to the needy. Students bring clothes in transparent polythene bags with the age of the child written on them, so they can be given to the same age group. Iron and fold them without crease and sometimes can keep a little surprise for that unknown child in the form of a chocolate or a toy hiding them inside. Feedback from the recipients is a reward in itself as they brought a difference at least to a small world with in their reach. No doubt young minds are like clay, we can mould them the way we want, but it should be full of verve, colour and positivity.

Vision of our school is "To make our students global citizens and future leaders of one world family". Our School is a nest to our students when they join the school, then they explore through the Satva, Bhakti, Dharma and Karma wings of the school shaping their personality, sharing, caring, experimenting, analysing, creating and designing their future ready to find their own horizon in this vast wide world.
